Guidelines for Authors

The purpose of the ISDRS Newsletter is to generate discourse about sustainable development through short articles, book reviews, reports, news items, updates, conference announcements and general information sharing, commentary and opinion.

Articles of up to 1000 words are sought that will engage people in the debate and are challenging. These are intended to be position papers or 'think-pieces' - stimulating articles that invite response rather than 'mini' academic papers. If these articles arise from previously published books, chapters or papers, it is the responsibility of authors to acknowledge the earlier source and to ensure that the article does not infringe any copyright agreements.

The Newsletter is not a journal, and academic papers that arise from articles published in the Newsletter may be submitted to the Sustainable Development Journal (<http://www.interscience.wiley.com/journal/sd>) or other journals on the ISDRS website (www.isdrs.org/journals.html).

The date for submission of articles will be published on the Society's website in good time for submission and the publication date will also be provided. Articles are to be submitted to the Editor: D.V.Springett@massey.ac.nz

Title of article and affiliations:

The first page should contain the full title of the article and the names and affiliations of all authors. Please provide the full address for each author, including e-mail, and asterisk the name of the chief author for correspondence. The article can then follow on immediately from this. Abstracts and key words are not required.

File type: The preferred format for manuscripts is .doc

Manuscript style.

The language of the Newsletter is British English. Manuscripts should be submitted in 12-point type in Times New Roman. It is not necessary to double-line space the manuscript. Tables and figures are not encouraged in these short articles.

Footnotes and References should be included only if strictly necessary. Any references that are supplied should be cited in the text as name and year only with the full reference included as a footnote.
